## COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

All Chicago Making Homelessness History (All Chicago), is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to ending homelessness across Chicago. As a part of the Community Health Peer Learning (CHP) Program, All Chicago and the University of Illinois Hospital and Health Sciences System (UI Health) are partnering to improve care coordination for Chicago residents who are housing insecure or homeless by integrating data from UI Health’s electronic health records with information about housing status from the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) managed by All Chicago. UI Health and All Chicago anticipate that these efforts will lead the way for greater integration of housing, health, and human services delivery systems at a national level.

## PROJECT APPROACH

To improve health outcomes and residential stability, All Chicago will lay the groundwork necessary to:

- Create and record structured data shared from All Chicago’s HMIS displayed and directly embedded into UI Health’s Cerner software;
- Share basic health information regarding healthcare utilization;
- Create a data interoperability framework for HMIS and EMR data transmission and sharing;
- Enlist participation from other hospital and healthcare facilities to enable connection to HMIS; and
- Leverage relationships with federal partners to align community efforts with federal goals.

## ANTICIPATED IMPACT

Our project envisions the integration of data about the status of housing insecurity/homelessness, by using rich databases, to create a powerful, coordinated effort that reduces cycle time from recognition of risk to referral to housing and services, resulting in improved health outcomes and residential stability.

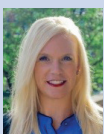
